Activity 1: Learn Frederick Douglass' Words (1st-4th Grade Levels)

Time Needed: 15-20 Minutes

Learning Objective: Develop word recognition and vocabulary that was used throughout Frederick Douglass' writings and speeches

Instructions:

- 1. Click the <u>Education</u> tab on the Frederick Douglass page and fill out the contact form in order to access the password protected educational materials.
- 2. Download the *Frederick Douglass Vocabulary Terms* form. (Please note the form is recommended for grade levels 1-4.)
- 3. Match the synonym and antonym for each vocabulary term. Write the synonym and antonym for each word in the respective column.

Time Needed: 30-60 Minutes

Learning Objective: Activate and build background knowledge related to themes within the reference materials

Instructions:

- 1. Click the <u>Education</u> tab on the Frederick Douglass page and fill out the contact form in order to access the password protected educational materials.
- 2. Download the *Frederick Douglass: Agitator Worksheet*. (Please note the worksheet is recommended for grade levels 5-12.)
- 3. Using the information throughout the *<u>Frederick Douglass: Agitator virtual exhibit</u>*, answer the questions provided on the worksheet.

- 2. Use the images in the folder to print and create a collage, or create one on your computer. You can use the photos to frame your own image of yourself or place yourself in one of the settings Douglass used, or take the masthead of his newspapers and write your own article for your cause.
